Dear Parents/Guardians and Well-wishers of Sathya Sai School,

Greetings from the Sathya Sai School of Toronto-Canada. Trust and hope you are enjoying a safe Summer so far. Five more weeks before we start the next school year 2021-2022.

The school year 2021-2022 looks promising and we will hope to have in-person classes. Now that almost all of the school parents had their two doses of vaccination and almost all Sathya Sai School students who are twelve years and above would have had their first dose of vaccination and will be totally immunized prior to school re-opening. We have not yet heard from Toronto Public Health (TPH) about vaccinating children below twelve years. Until that period, we are not out of the woods yet. Therefore, continue practicing health and hygiene as you have been doing since March 13, 2020.

The school will be sending a Parent Survey to get consensus with the next steps that the school would follow based on your feedback as well TPH directives. Kindly note that once you make any commitment on the Survey, your statement will hold true until December, 2021. Your child will not have the flexibility to choose back and forth during the period from September 7, 2021 until December 2021 as was previously allowed. The Pandemic Working Group in conjunction with the Building Management Team will be taking the Parent Survey consensus into account while setting up the classrooms in the next few weeks. Thank you for your cooperation.

Despite the pandemic and online teaching format, our school teachers have all completed grade curricula and awards ceremony for all grades. Both Kindergarten II and Grade Eight graduations virtual graduations were well coordinated by the Home Room teachers – Ms. Merna Claudius, Mrs. Vandana Jhawar and Mrs. Nandini Menon along with their Parent Council Representatives, Mr. Santosh Guduru, Mrs. Neha Choksi and Mrs. Christine Maharaj. The IT Team members – Mr. Manish Rughani and Mr. Arun Maharaj – created the magic in the virtual graduations with a touch of their wands.

Heritage Months June: Indigenous History Month

To recognize the Traditional and Ancestral lands of the Indigenous people of Canada, Sathya Sai School begins its day with the daily **Land Acknowledgement**, as part of the school's morning routine, and at the beginning of all gatherings, to be spoken before 'O Canada':

"We acknowledge we are hosted on the lands of the Mississaugas of the Anishinaabe, the Haudenosaunee Confederacy and the Wendat. We also recognize the enduring presence of all First Nations, Métis and the Inuit peoples."

• Presentation - Orange Shirt Day, by Jiah Patel:

Orange Shirt Day is on September 30th and is a day to think about the many First Nations students who were taken away from their families to be colonized. This means, taking people away from their homes and being placed some place new. As our teacher Ms. Sharanigan explained, First Nations students were taken away from their communities and were placed in residential school. At residential school, they were not allowed to speak their own native language, practice their spiritual beliefs, wear their own culture's clothes, or keep their hair as their ancestors did.



The orange shirt in Orange Shirt Day refers to the new shirt that a First Nations child named Phyllis got from her grandmother on her first day of residential school. When she got to school, they took away all her clothes, including her new shirt. It was never returned. For Phyllis, the colour orange has always reminded her of her experiences at residential school, and as she has said, 'how my feelings didn't matter, how no one cared, how all the residential school children were crying and no one did anything about it.' The message that Phyllis wants to pass along on Orange Shirt Day and every day is that every child matters. Phyllis started Orange Shirt Day to educate people about residential schools and fighting racism and bullying. My value connection is Empathy. I hope that everybody wears an orange shirt on Orange Shirt Day to remember that every child matters, especially the First Nations children that have gone through, and are still going through, a lot of trouble. Thank you for listening.

Cyber Security Workshop

On June 11, Cognizant Outreach presented a virtual Cyber Security Workshop for all parents and for students in grades 5 to 8. The presenters were Ms. Anusha Kumar and Mr. Naveen Krishnamoorthy.²

Since we have been spending most of our time online, students need to learn how to think more responsibly as Internet users. Therefore, Cyber Safety is most important.

1. How can I use the Internet safely?

APPS – Are the apps we get onto and use to chat with our friends, are they safe? Mr. Krishnamoorthy gave an example of an email he received, asking him to buy a \$200 gift card and give it to a friend. The person who sent it was a friend, but who never sends an email like this. Later, this person sent an email to all her contacts explaining that her app and password were hacked.

Is your password strong enough? 1) It should be longer, at least 12 characters. 2) Mix upper and lower case letters. 3) Add symbols. Hackers try to create passwords using your name and other obvious words.

Phishing is a fraudulent attempt to obtain sensitive information or data, such as username, passwords, credit card number, etc. e.g. "Get a cool offer, wireless headset for \$1. Be careful – no one gives anything for free. Mistake: A girl ordered this by creating her profile and paying through her credit card. Important: don't provide any such personal information

Misuse of downloading software. If you download something that is streaming, without legal

authorization, the company can send you a message that you have infringed on copyright information and charge you. If it is wrong, don't do it.

Geotagging. When you take a selfie, each picture leaves a trail. When you post it on the Internet and if it has geotags, anyone can find your location. Important: turn off the GPS.

Selfie Awareness Organization. If strangers are trying to get you to identify yourself, do not give out any personal information. Be careful when posting pictures – everything in the chat gets recorded.

Games. – Keep chats relevant to the game.

- -- Never provide personal, private, or secure information.
- -- Try to set up private chats with known friends only.
- -- Never spend real currency in a game without getting permission.
- -- Respect age requirements on games. Don't change your age, name, etc.

Secure your computer and personal information.

- -- Download/stream from reputable sites.
- -- Get proper antivirus and keep it updated.
- -- Use strong passwords.
- -- Question what you see in pop-ups, emails, attachments.

Surfing the Internet.

- -- Attend to warnings about a site's safety or expired certificate.
- -- Look for HTTPS!
- -- Your browser and website should be updated regularly.

Cyber Bullying. When someone is intentionally and repeatedly mean to someone through technology. This can be done through texts, apps, online media, etc. If you are being bullied: **STOP – BLOCK – TELL**

- 1) Never respond to these messages
- 2) Block the messages
- 3) Tell a parent, adult, or teacher immediately

True / False

- -- Chatting with school friends and family online is a great way to communicate. **True,** but be very careful in what you share. The communication can be tapped by the public.
- -- Agreeing to meet up with someone you met online is a good idea and totally safe. **False**
- -- It is rude to block someone online, even if they are asking weird and uncomfortable questions. **False**
- -- If you send pictures to someone online, you can't control what happens to them. **True**, be very careful what you send and to whom. Get permission from parents.

Tips to remember.

- -- It is a public place. It is easy to lose control of your data here.
- -- It is an uncensored site. Avoid sites with this warning.
- -- Trust your instincts. Block anyone who seems weird.
- -- It is illegal to threaten someone. Tell a safe adult if being threatened.

Q: What is a secure site?

A: https – a secure site.

Q: What is defined as personal information?

A: Name, date of birth, home address, phone number, parents number, etc.

Q: What if a weird question is meant as a joke?

A: Don't answer it.

Q: Is it OK to have a spam email?

A: These often have malicious links. Remove all spams.

Q: When someone creates a fake account, can hackers find your information?

A: Be ethical in the virtual world.

Q: What are ways of identifying phishing emails?

A: When shopping, these emails often include ads and links that lead to phishing. If you read the emails closely, you will see:

- -- mistakes in the message
- -- at the end the person is pushing you to do something
- -- check the domain name and email ID it may be suspicious.

Q: What should you do if you are hacked?

A: Change all the security information:

- -- Change passwords
- -- Change security settings.

Q: Is it safe when children are uploading videos?

A: Students, make sure you are creating with parent control. Make sure the comments section is blocked.

Don't store credit card information on sites. We don't have control over any information that goes out.

Research websites that ask you to create an account.Students, talk to your parents and teachers to make

sure before you create profiles.

You need a proper anti-virus software and keep it updated. Paid versions have more updates, e.g. McAfee, Kaspersky, Norton, etc.

Grade 4 Science: Rocks and Minerals

Students explored the crystal structure of minerals by making rock candies. They thoroughly enjoyed the kitchen chemistry that turns a solution of sugar and water into a tasty treat.

















Grade 5 Conservation of Energy & Resources

During the science unit on Conservation of Energy and Resources, the students learned about how energy transforms from one form to another. They also learned how it is important to save and not waste energy.

We then integrated this concept into SSEHV by taking an example of a bicycle; in order to ride it and reach a destination, one needs a lot of patience and energy. Energy transforms from the chemical energy (from the food we eat) into mechanical energy. If we waste our energy, we may not be able to push our limits to reach the destination while riding the bicycle. We need to preserve energy and patiently work our way through the uphill climb in order to enjoy the downhill joyride. We then tied this up with an art activity of making paper bicycles. This activity required them to make 50 paper straws which needed a lot of patience. 





Grade 5 Classbook on Empathy


